- ***Democracy for All Amendment*** – **S.J.Res. 5.** [Text.](#) [Sponsors.](#) Introduced on January 21, 2015 by **Sen. Tom Udall**. Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States relating to contributions and expenditures intended to affect elections.
- **S.J.Res. 7.** [Text.](#) [Sponsors.](#) Introduced on February 4, 2015 by **Sen. Jon Tester**. Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States to clarify the authority of Congress and the States to regulate corporations, limited liability companies, and other corporate entities established by the laws of any State, the United States, or any foreign state.
